#### **CHOOSING YOUR SECTIONAL ACTIVITIES**

Time to start thinking about choosing section activities! The **volunteering** section must be done for **12 months**, **1 hour per week** (can be condensed to 2 hours every two weeks). The **physical** and **skills** sections will need to be done for **6 months**, **1 hour a week**. Choose one of these sections to do for **12 months** instead of **6 months**.

Your chosen activity will need approving by your DofE leader, this will be done through eDofE (details below). When you attend your first eDofE session you should come with an idea of the activities you want to do for each of the sections and also have an idea who will be your assessor for each section.

Your chosen assessor should be someone over 18 years old who has some knowledge of your chosen activity and they cannot be related to you.

#### **REGISTER FOR EDOFE**

**eDofE** is the online portal where you will record any evidence and progress for each section of your award and keep in touch with your DofE leaders.

Now that you have been enrolled, your DofE leader will create your eDofE account.

You will receive your login details during your first eDofE session and our instructors will help you sign into your account for the first time. This is when you will sign the Code of Behaviour.

As mentioned above the first eDofE session will be more productive if you arrive with ideas for activities and the names of the people you would like to be your assessors.



#### THE EXPEDITION SECTION

As part of the training for your expedition you will be sent some elearning along with a Knowledge Check that you will be required to complete before the practice expedition.

This is to refresh the skills you've already learnt during the Bronze and Silver Awards so you can get the most out of your time faceto-face with our instructors.

#### PERSONAL KIT FOR YOUR EXPEDITION

Personal kit (walking boots, waterproof clothing, rucksack, sleeping bag and roll mat) can be hired from C I Adventures for a small fee. Kit hire prices can be found in the FAQs.

However if you would like to purchase the necessary equipment instead, we recommend this is done with plenty of time to wear in/get familiar with the kit before the expedition.

#### **Personal Kit List:**

- Walking Boots Something waterproof and sturdy with good ankle support
- Waterproof Jacket AND Trousers Waterproof/windproof with a hood
- Expedition Rucksack Chest and waist straps, at least 60Ltr
- Day Rucksack/Backpack Must be comfy and fit extra layers plus your lunch
- Sleeping Bag 3/4 season (The evenings will still be cold in April!). Must be compact
- Sleep Mat

There are a lot of options for buying kit to suit every budget.

Sports Direct, Mountain Warehouse & Decathlon have some good budget options.

Cotswold, Millets, Go Outdoors & Blacks all offer a discount to DofE participants with a discount card.

## PAYMENTS

The Gold Award costs £452 (or £552 for Direct)

This amount is broken up into 3 payments (4 for Direct) that are to be made by ParentPay.

#### **NOTES:**

The first payment is a non-refundable deposit as this includes a mandatory registration fee which goes directly to the DofE charity.

These payments are <u>not</u> inclusive of equipment hire (see FAQs).

If you are experiencing any issues with ParentPay, you will need to contact the school as C I Adventures does not handle ParentPay payments.

# CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

#### <u>During the course of my DofE award I agree to:</u>

- 1. Take ownership of my own award
- 2. Represent myself, my school, C I Adventures and the Duke of Edinburgh organisation to the highest standard
- 3. Uphold the core values of the DofE award
- 4. Challenge myself to embrace new experiences and opportunities
- 5. Be respectful towards all instructors and be ready to learn
- 6. Always follow the C I Adventures phone policy

#### On expedition I agree to:

- 1. Follow the Countryside Code
- 2. Be mindful of other people especially in public spaces
- 3. Act safely and responsibly at all times
- 4. Follow C I Adventures Campsite Etiquette Guide (<u>Available</u> <u>Here</u>)

## Please be advised the following behaviour will not be tolerated and will result in an immediate call home to be picked up:

- 1. Drug use or possession
- 2. Smoking or vaping
- 3. Any violent or abusive behaviour
- 4. Alcohol possession or consumption
- 5. Entering ANY tent you have not been assigned to (After 'settle in' has been declared by your Supervisor)
- 6. Failure to report anyone who is missing from your tent who should be there or failing to report anyone who is in your tent who should not be there

Please read through the above carefully. You will be required to sign a copy of this during your first eDofE session.

# PHONE POLICY

#### **During the training:**

- Phones are to remain packed away in rucksacks unless authorised by your instructor.
- Please ask permission if you would like to use your phone, for example checking messages from parents or taking a photo.

#### During the expedition:

The Lead instructor will be using our dedicated DofE mobile phone. Two members of each team will be asked to join a WhatsApp group with the Lead Instructor and share their live location for the day.

- This can ONLY be set up by the person sharing their location.
- WhatsApp automatically stops live location sharing after eight hours (maximum).
- All participant phone numbers will be deleted at the end of the expedition.
- The DofE phone will remain locked in the C I Adventures office when not in use on training/expedition weekends.

Please note that live location sharing is completely voluntary. If there are no participants willing to do so in a team, they will be provided with an emergency phone (no internet access) so instructors can contact them in case of emergency.

With the exception of the above, phones should remain in rucksacks on airplane mode unless:

- It is being used to take a photograph.
- It is being used as part of your team project (with prior approval).
- It is an emergency situation.

#### At all times (Including camp):

- Social media is prohibited.
- Please ask permission before taking photos of anyone, including teammates.
- Playing music is not permitted.

Failure to follow this phone policy will result in a warning in the first instance, phone confiscation in the second instance (returned at the end of the day) and confiscation for the rest of the expedition, plus a call home in the third instance.

# PRACTICE EXPEDITION

When?

Friday 2nd May 2025 to Sunday 4th May 2025 Where?

It will take place in the Yorkshire Dales.

The exact meeting point will be determined at a date closer to the expedition.

What will I need to bring?

Personal Kit: Walking boots, rucksack (day & expedition), water proofs, suitable clothing, first aid kit (At least one between your group).

Food: Lunch for 3 days, evening meal for 2 nights, breakfast for 2 mornings and snacks.

Other: Gas for your teams stoves, campsite fees (exact cost will be sent through before the weekend).

We will provide maps, tents, Trangia stoves, compasses and an emergency contact card

**Itinerary** 

#### **Day One**

Meet at campsite, set up camp, each team will go an a day walk with an instructor to refresh their navigational skills.

#### **Day Two**

Teams will walk to the second campsite under remote supervision. If more navigational instruction is required an instructor will walk with you in the morning.

#### **Day Three**

Teams will walk from the second campsite to the pick up point under remote supervision. At lunch your instructor will meet up with your team to discuss the route options for the assessed expedition.

Can my Auntie/Uncle/Grandma/ Dad be the section assessor for my volunteering/physical/s kills section?	No, your section assessor cannot be related to you. Your section supervisor must be over 18 and should be knowledgeable on your chosen activity. If you have chosen a fairly independent activity then trusted family friends and neighbours can be a fantastic option for assessors. For example if you chose gardening for your skills section then your next door neighbour could be your assessor. For more information about section assessors and how they can submit

Can I volunteer for a business?	Generally speaking, no you cannot volunteer for a business although there are some exceptions. For example you cannot volunteer to do unpaid labour for a nursing home eg cleaning, cooking meals etc however you could volunteer to read to residents. If you're not sure if what you have in mind qualifies for the volunteering section it's best to check with us first. Please also note you cannot volunteer to help your parents clean up at home!
When will I get my DofE card?	You will be able to apply for your DofE card when you're set up on eDofE. We will show you how to do this during your first eDofE

session.

## FAQs (cont)

What is the Countryside Code?	The Countryside Code is a set of guidelines on how to enjoy the outdoors while respecting and protecting our natural spaces. The full Countryside Code can be found Here.
What will I be doing during the eDofE route planning session?	Now you have started working towards your Gold award you are required to be more involved with the planning stage of the expedition. During the route planning session you will plan your own route with your team, our instructors will be there to show you how to do this and offer guidance. We will discuss this more during your initial eDofE session.
What about the Assessed Expedition?	Details regarding the Assessed Expedition will follow at a later date.
